Building on the successful year of 2018, 2019 has been another productive year where TLV committee celebrated the completion and commissioning of Rialico Water Project (Maubisse). The formal hand over of the infrastructure to community, maintenance crews and the primary school were featured on Timor Leste national television (TVTL) and newspapers stories. The project scope includes constructing a 5km pipe system and public toilets. It provides access to clean water and toilets for 64 families and a primary school and allow.

In 2018, TLV was successfully selected and awarded to receive the inaugural round of Australian Aid; Friendship Grant from Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT). TLV was one of the 24 small to medium charities in Australia working various in countries to receive the grant. The Friendship Grant will allow TLV to build sanitation facilities and provide health education to schools and community of 3 villages (Beremanek, Tahu –Nein and Debuwa'en) in Same Municipality.

The Friendship Grant will also assist TLV Timor in providing administration capabilities to assist the preparation of application to formally become a Non-Government Organisation (NGO) in Timor. This will transformed and provides opportunities for TLV Timor to raise funds and undertake more collaboration with local and international NGO in Timor. Hence, thank you for those who take part in making the grant possible.

Finally, on behalf of TLV executives committee I would like to thank all of the TLV's volunteers and supporters who made this year's quiz night, footy tipping and movie night another successes. Thank you all for your passion, time, and commitment in helping delivering the strong outcomes this year.

# **Projects - Infrastructure**

## **Rialico Water Project – completed June 2019**

Rialico Water and Sanitation Project Rialico is situated in the Municipality of Ainaro, around 70km north west of Dili, and is one of many isolated villages. Due to a damaged water supply, the villages did not have access to fresh, clean and portable water. The closest water source was 3kms away, with community members, including pregnant women and children, walking to the source to collect water daily. TLV were contacted by a Dr in Timor Leste seeking assistance for the village. There are 64 families in Rialico, which consist of 420 community members (320 adults and 100 children).



## Manufahi Sanitation Project – Same

Manufahi Sanitation Project aims to improve sanitation through building toilet facilities and providing health education to 3 villages in Manufahi municipality (Same). The project will benefit around 2000 members of community (201 families/households) and 2500 or more during traditional ceremonies due to family visit and visitors to the villages:

- Beremanek
- Tahu-Bein
- Debuwa'en

In 2018, TLV Timor was approached by one of Timor Leste's youth groups; UJ-Bertade with a proposal identifying these 3 villages as priorities recognising the activity's immense value and great need to reduce and eradicate open defecation practiced by the rural communities in the area. This results in girls not being able to attend school each month and may cause potential serious illnesses to the broader community.

On completion of the project a strategy will be developed for the long-term maintenance of the sanitation system, as well as education on hygiene and promotion of positive health outcomes.

The design and planning commenced early 2019 with a volunteer TLV engineer, Clive Rawson, visiting the villages in Timor Leste for a detailed scoping and design. The finalised project scoping identified the needs of building 20 toilet units at the school and located at sacred houses in the communities. In June 2019 the toilet design and drawings were completed and approved with the construction divided into 3 different phases.



The toilet unit at the school will have a separate room for boys and girls with clear sign names on the entrance. They will have a station for hand washing and the ramp with handle will also be built for disabilities and wheel chair access.

Phase 1 – completed
 Commenced 1 July to 1 A

Commenced 1 July to 1 August. This consists of building 7 toilet units, including 1 unit at the school.

- Phase 2 completed Commenced 1 August to 1 September. This consists of building 6 toilet units.
- Phase 3 in progress This consists of building 7 toilets.


