Project implementation and fundraising opportunities were impacted due to lockdowns and necessary restrictions. Though there were these challenges, with modern technology we were able to communicate regularly via zoom and WhatsApp meetings. Abel, President of TLV Timor and Christian, Project Manager based in Perth, were able to begin to plan the kindergarten/pre-school project in Ponilala, District of Ermera. We were able to have the football tipping again, crowd funding for the flooding catastrophe and later in the year a movie night was shown and the TLV Quiz Night was once again held and was a sold-out event. Thanks to the TLV Fundraising team for the many hours of organisation given for our successful events.

> On 4th April 2021 Timor Leste was hit with catastrophic flooding, causing:

• 33,177 total affected households across

country

- 13,554 temporary displaced people in Dili
- 40 evacuation facilities in Dili
- 44 fatalities that have been recorded
- 2,163 Hectares of agricultural areas affected across the country

Infrastructure, such as roads, bridges, water pipes and other public infrastructure was either destroyed or damaged. A fundraising campaign was launched over three months and with funds raised we were able to assist many people who urgently needed help. More can be read on page 6.

## The Flooding

The people in Timor Leste went through a heartbreaking time on Easter Sunday, being 4thApril, when it was hit with torrential rain and storms, causing devastating flooding to a country already suffering terribly from Covid, and on its knees as one of the world's poorest and hungriest nations.

The impact of the 2021 flooding was staggering – significant loss of life, many thousands of people had been displaced and were living between 30 camps, lack of sanitation, water pipes being damaged or destroyed, infrastructure damage and destruction, thousands at risk of starvation, malnutrition and disease.

Together, the TLV Perth, TLV Timor and our supporters were able to give assistance and deliver critical items including food, water, baby needs and other essential items for the most vulnerable in the community. 125 university students also registered with us and also needed urgent assistance for food and accommodation. Due to CoVid19 restrictions families were unable to enter Dili to help their children.

We worked exclusively based on the immediate community needs as expressed by our TLV team in Timor Leste, and were able to assist besieged families within 48 hours of the catastrophic flooding. TLV Timor was able to give immediate response to urgent requests from communities and individuals in desperate need. Please see next page for a summary of the assistance TLV was able to provide.

- 13,534 temporary displaced people in dili
- 48 fatalities have been recorded

- Infrastructure, such as roads, bridges, water pipes and other public infrastructure was either destroyed or badly damaged.

# **TLV Flooding**

## **Response Actions**

TLV initiated an immense fundraising campaign in Perth, WA, and immediately were able to send funds to the TLV Timor team to assist those affected and in need.

The TLV Timor team were able to hit the ground running, and worked tirelessly, within a few days, delivering food, water, vouchers for food and accommodation for students.

We had many requests on the ground asking for urgent assistance and conducted specific fundraising which raised sufficient funds to enable TLV Timor to:

- Distribute critical food, water, other essential items) to over 550 families.
- Distribute food to 137 students who had been unable to work to sustain themselves and had little or no food.
- Ensure 20 students had accommodation and living needs. The students were to be evicted due to being unable to pay for their accommodation due to consequences of the flooding and families unable to assist.
- Making deliveries of fresh water to areas and sucos within Dili that were in urgent need.

## **Completed projects**

#### Manufahi Sanitation Project - Completed

In partnership with 3 communities in Manufahi and Youth Group, UJ Bertade, TLV built 19 community sanitation systems ending open defecation and promoting positive health outcomes. The communities prioritised this need recognising the activity's immense value. Limited access to sanitation negatively impacts community health, wellbeing and access to education. Community member Maria says: "We as young woman feel like this is a huge positive impact because it facilitates us as the grandchildren when we gather together to not go to toilet to the bushes or forest anymore."

#### **Rialico Water and Sanitation – Completed**

Rialico did not have access to water or sanitation facilities and TLV were contacted by Elders in the District informing us of the urgent need for water and sanitation. There are 64 families in Rialico, which consist of 420 community members. Having access to water will eliminate many diseases, especially skin disease in children, school children will have a toilet and agricultural crops can be grown.

#### **Funar Water and Sanitation - Completed**

Funar has two community schools and approximately 1,790 inhabitants. However, the only source of water available to the community was a 7km walk away, and the two toilets located at the schools had been badly damaged by the weather conditions and could not be used, and student's needed to use the nearby bush. The system has been repaired and extended to ensure water delivery to both schools and households. Public toilets have been constructed at the schools to ensure the children now have access to clean sanitation.

#### Hatete Water and Sanitation - Completed

Hatete is home to over 77 families, and has a community school, chapel and a small hospital. However the only source of water available to the community was an hour's walk away. The system delivers water to the community facilities including the school and hospital and to all households. Public toilets have been built at the school and other key areas identified by the community.



#### **Biblioteka Ermera Library - Completed**

In 2010, a new partnership was formed between TLV and Biblioteka Ermera. Biblioteka Ermera was set up by a not-forprofit organisation to help raise literacy levels in the District. TLV partnered with this organisation for three years. We supported the building of a new library branch in Hatolia, purchased furniture for the main library in Gleno and paid for Tetum books to be produced and distributed.

#### TLV Scholarship Program and Student Accommodation Fund – Completed

When the program commenced in 2005 there was no secondary school in the subdistrict of Letefoho. in 2005, only 6% of boys and 4% of girls from the area had the opportunity to complete senior high school. In response to this, TLV started our Scholarship program. We select students for sponsorships based on their performance in the national examinations and ensure an equal gender balance. Student's sponsorship covers education costs such as tuition fees, books and transport to and from university.

#### **Ainaro Boarding School - Completed**

Despite having a population of 52,500, the capital of the District of Ainaro was the only place where students could access a high school education. Many students from neighbouring towns were missing out due to distance and limited transport options. There was a well-established Girls Boarding College in Ainaro, but the Boys Boarding College was completely dilapidated and could only accommodate a handful of students. On completion of the project, the school was able to accept extra 100 students.

#### Scholarship Student Accommodation Fund - Completed

Accommodation for students in Dili is extremely limited and TLV's sponsored students were all impacted by this shortage. Many students risked dropping out of school as their families could not afford to pay for private accommodation, or did not have the option of living with family in Dili. TLV identified other housing options to ensure that students were provided with suitable living conditions while they completed their tertiary studies.

#### **Communities - Completed**

Delivering much needed items to schools and an orphanage which is home to approximately 300 children. Items such as desks, chairs, uniform for school, stationary.



## Pre-Primary School Ponilala, Ermera

TLV's current infrastructure project, a pre-school in the village of Ponilala in the district of Ermera, aims to provide a safe environment for children to learn and thrive. The construction of the pre-school will include two classrooms, an administration office, one sanitation/toilet block, and a library. This project, once completed, will benefit over sixty children from the ages three to seven.

In late 2019, TLV answered a request from the former TLV alumni, Basilio, to build a preprimary school in his home village (aldeia) Ponilala. The design and planning of the project commenced mid 2020 with internal and external meetings regarding the feasibility of the project. Since then, COVID-19 and major flooding in many parts of the country and the consequent lack of funding put a hold on the project. In the meantime, strong efforts were made to raise more money for the project, which included a quiz night, a movie night and a Bunnings Sausage sizzle.



Over the last few months, TLV established a solid project team, comprised of both TLV Timor Leste and TLV Perth members. The project team is currently working on the final design of the pre-school before the final design can be incorporated into the Project Management Plan and signed off be the Executive Committee. This is a major milestone for TLV and the community of Ponilala. Once signed by all committee members, there should be nothing in the way of putting down the foundation and start construction. The expected duration of the build is around three months, depending on the local labour market and availability of construction materials.

The aim is to start the foundation of the pre-school and sanitation block in June 2022 and finish the construction prior to Christmas 2022. This would allow the inauguration of the pre-school with the community and TLV representatives and allow enough time to be ready for the new school year in Timor Leste. We, as Timor Leste Vision, are looking forward to seeing young children have an opportunity to learn and thrive at the new pre-school by the beginning of 2023!

TLV fundraising during CoVid19 has been a challenge once again with a limited number of fundraising opportunities, though the TLV team and fundraising team worked very hard and raised over \$60,000. The annual Quiz Night was held in October 2021 and raised an amazing \$16,188.46 for the pre-school/kindergarten project. \$2,000 of this was specifically for the children's first year of education, enabling purchase of stationery and other items for them. Activities for the year consisted of:

- On Sunday 31st January 2021 we held a Bunnings Sausage Sizzle, which was interrupted by a lockdown that afternoon.
- The annual football tipping competition had 34 tippers, and was run by Stephen Pollard and Denny Roberts.
- A crowdfunding fundraising campaign was held to raise funds for the victims of the catastrophic floods in Timor Leste on 4th April.
- An Emergency Relief raffle was organised quickly to raise funds for urgent need for flooding victims.
- A movie night was held at the Windsor Cinema in Nedlands showing Respect.
